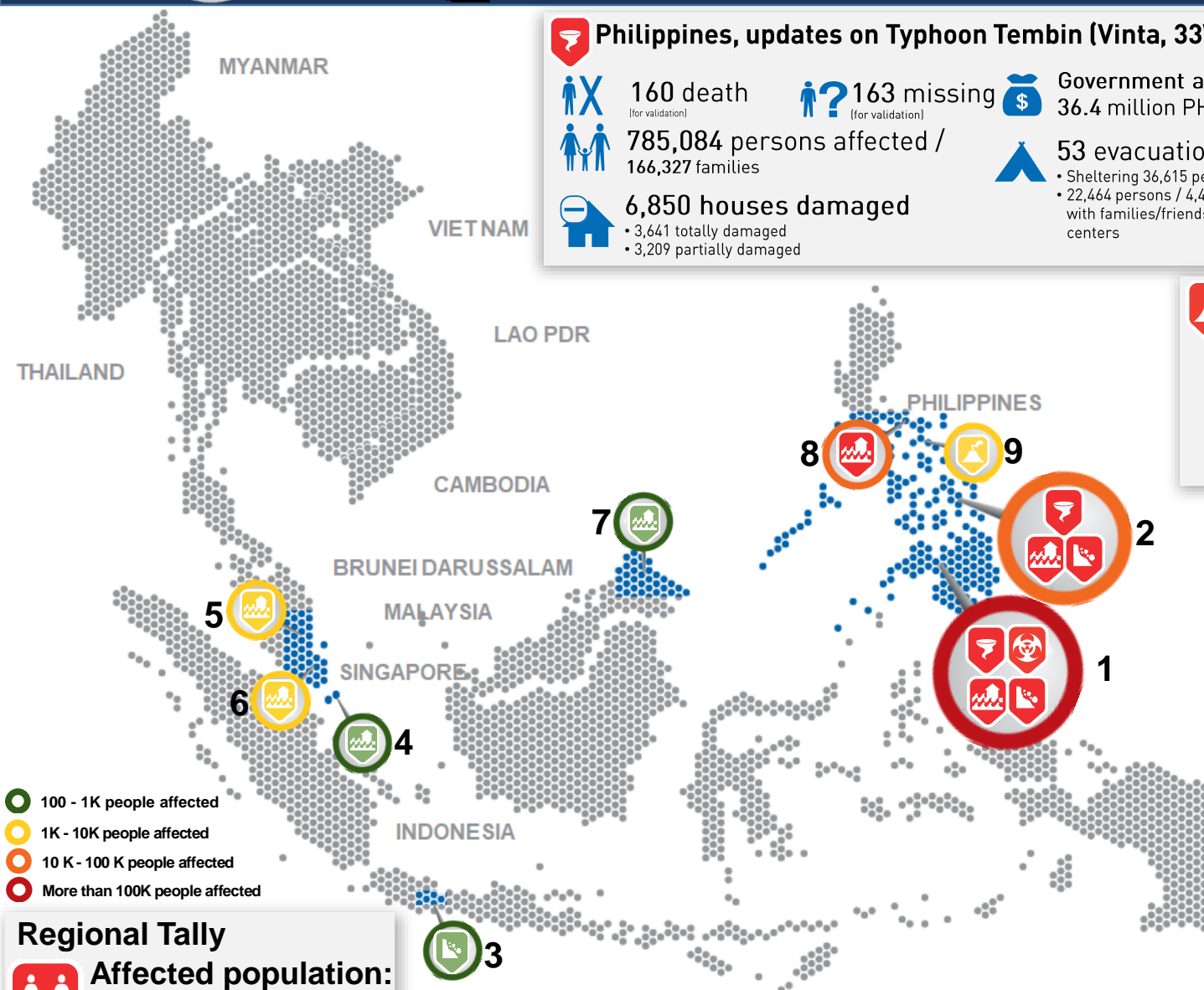

Philippines, Alert Level 3 for Mount Mayon,

- 1) [PHIVOLCS-DOST](#) raised Mt. Mayon's status from Alert Level 2 to Level 3 (increased tendency towards hazardous eruption) on 14-Jan-2018 20:00 UTC+8.
- 2) [DSWD](#) reported 3,338 persons (948 families) in Albay Province are affected due to Mt. Mayon Phreatic Eruption.
- 3) AHA Centre is closely monitoring the situation.
