## Myanmar

- [Department of Disaster Management \(DDM\)](#) has been monitoring the flooding situation since the start of the monsoon season.
- Since 4 June 2018, AHA Centre has been following the reports of floods in Myanmar on [ADInet](#).
- Based on figures provided by DDM, a total of 8 states/regions have recorded floods thus far. These floods had affected a total of 12,295 families and 57,067 persons till date.
- [Department of Meteorology and Hydrology](#) have been issuing flood warnings since the 24 Jul 2018 for the Karen State, Mon State and Bago Region (most affected thus far). 160 evacuation shelters were set up to house 12,086 families (56,257 persons).
- AHA Centre had also noted [flooding in Taninthayi Region](#) on 18 July 2018 resulting from a low pressure area detected during week 28 (9- 15 Jul 2018).
- The Government of Myanmar had already provided relief items of Food items, Non-food items and cash assistance which are worth about USD 110,177.
- The Emergency Coordination Meeting of the National Disaster Management Committee chaired by the Vice President H.E U Henry Van Thio was held in July 28 to discuss on effective and efficient response measures.
- H.E President U Win Myint, accompanied by H.E Prof. Dr. Win Myat Aye, Vice Chair for the National Disaster Management Committee, Union Minister for the Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement, visited Bago Region to encourage and provide the humanitarian assistance to the flood affected people in Bago Region.
- AHA Centre is closely monitoring the effects of the monsoon season in the Northern Region of ASEAN.
