

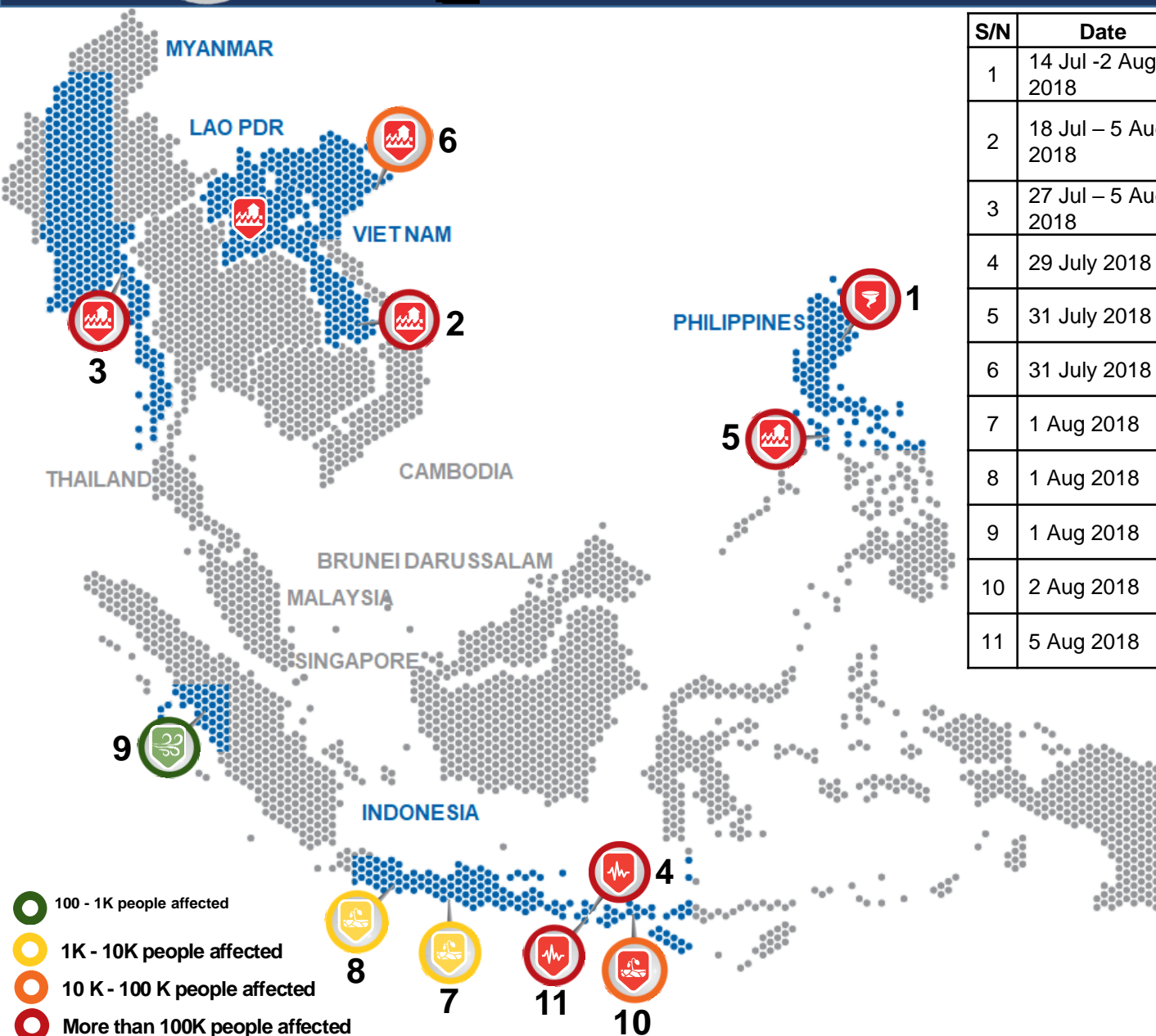

## Regional Summary of Week 31 and Outlook for Week 32

- 1) Throughout Week 31, in total 11 moderate-to-major disasters occurred in ASEAN region, which include four ongoing emergency response operations.
- 2) AHA Centre is engaging in multiple response scenario to disasters in Lao PDR (Effect of TS Son-Tinh & collapsed of Xe-Pien & Xe Nam Noyu Dam) and Myanmar Monsoon Floods, with potential emergency response operations to a M 7.0 Earthquake in Indonesia (5 August 2018).

- 4) AHA Centre also noted the eruption and increased activities of Mount Anak Krakatau in Week 31. There were no casualties and damages reported (MoH).
- 5) A M 7.0 earthquake occurred in Lombok, Indonesia, on 5 August 2018, which briefly triggered tsunami warning. It resulted in significant casualties and damages, in addition to M 6.4 earthquake occurred one week earlier (29 July 2018). AHA Centre is closely monitoring the situation and in-contact with Government of Indonesia through BNPB.
- 6) Drought reports have been consistently identified in various rural areas in southern part of ASEAN region three weeks in a row, stretching from south of Java Island to Sumba Island. Around 150,000 people requires clean water provision, which so far fulfilled by local disaster management organizations.
- 7) The remaining seven disasters occurred in Week 31 were within the capacity of respective ASEAN Member States.
