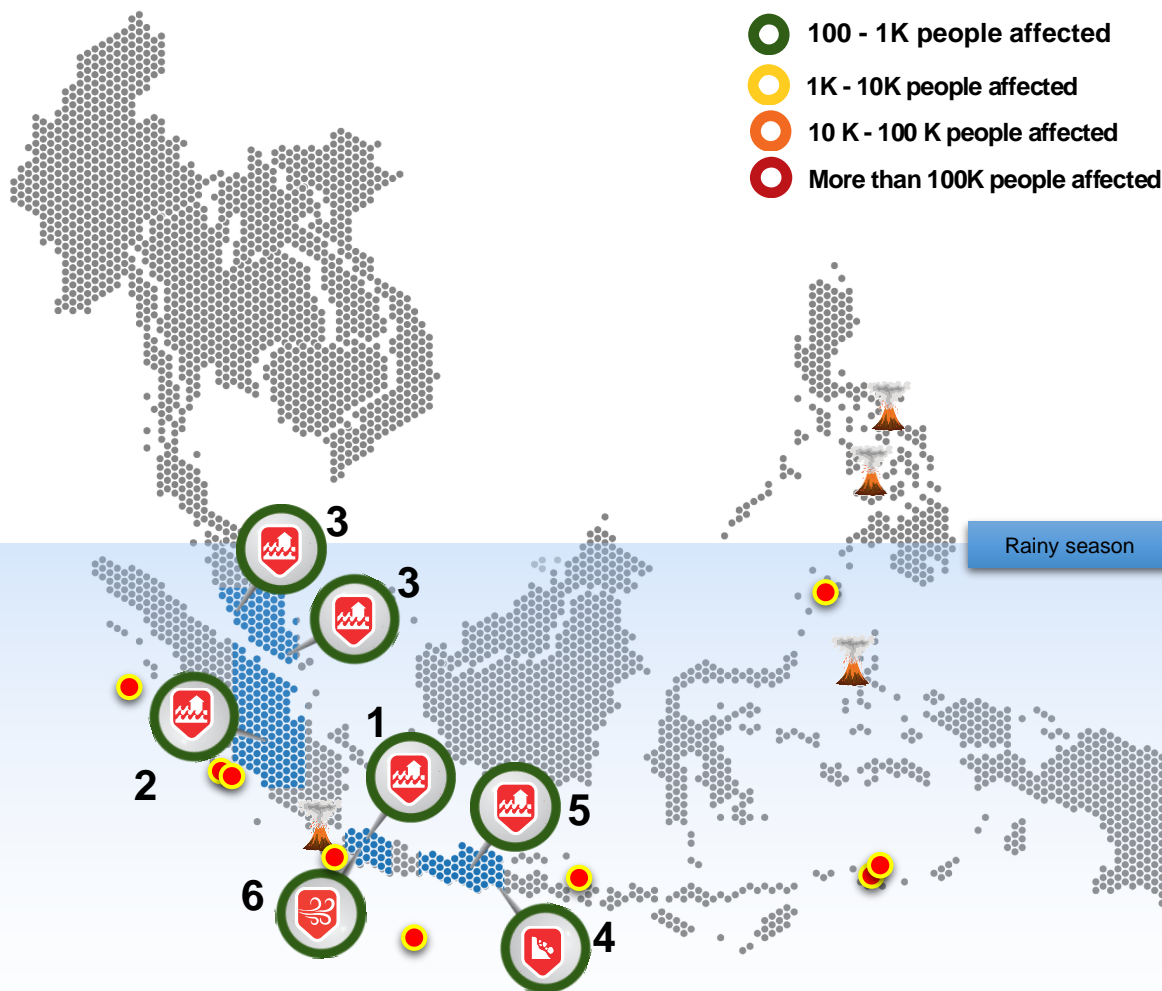

## Regional Summary of Week 49, and Outlook for Week 50

- In Week 49, hydro-meteorological hazards may be causing disruption but geophysical hazards are increasing in activity. Over the past week, 9 earthquakes of more than M5.0 were reported in the region. There was also increased activity reported for Mt Mayon, Mt Kanlaon and Mt Dukono and Mt Anak Krakatau. ([BMKG](#))
- ASEAN Specialised Meteorological Centre ([ASMC](#)) reported that the Northeast Monsoon season will bring the traditional dry season to the northern ASEAN region, and more shower activities to the southern ASEAN region. Drier-than-usual conditions that have persisted over much of the Philippines and northern Borneo are forecast to continue. There are signs of [Madden-Julian Oscillation \(MJO\)](#) strengthening in the Pacific Ocean. The MJO is expected to further develop and propagate through Phase 2 in the latter part of fortnight. This may bring more rainfall than average to the equatorial South China Sea region, with the highest likelihood over southern Thailand and northern Peninsular Malaysia towards the second week of December. Temperatures in the Mekong sub-region are expected to be slightly warmer.
- Given the weather conditions, it will be prudent to look out for vector borne and water borne diseases following flash floods. Landslide risk should be taken note especially in areas with high risk of slope failure. [PVMBG](#) has forecasted increased potential land movements in most parts of Sumatra, Java (mainly west and central), Kalimantan, Bali, Nusa Tenggara Timur, Nusa Tenggara Barat, Maluku and Papua..
- Geophysical hazards seems to be reporting increased activity, travellers to volcanic areas are advised to take note of local government advisories before ascending. Travellers are also advised to be informed of the permanent danger zone (PDZ) and evacuation notices in high-risk areas.
- All reported disasters were within the coping capacity of the member states..

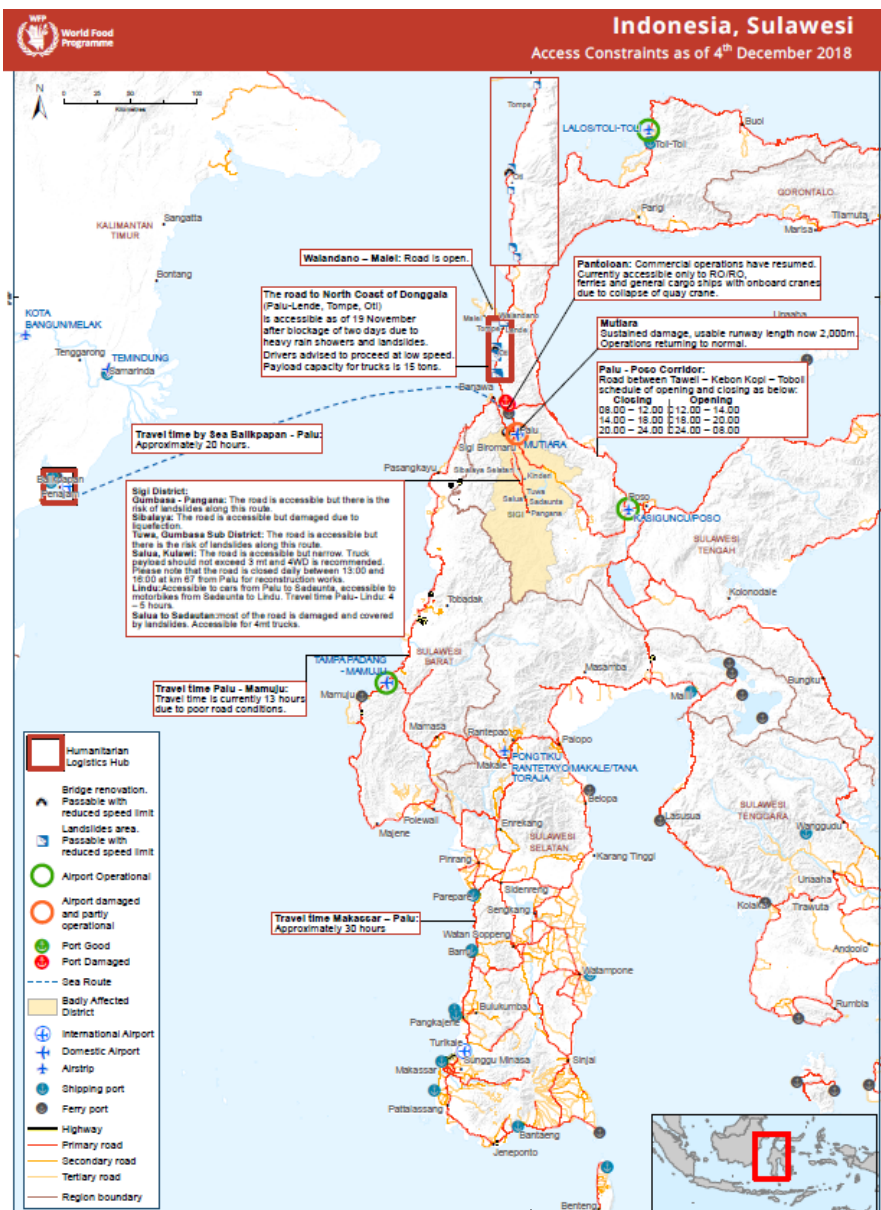

- Currently, there are 170 organisations providing assistance on the ground carrying out 4940 activities across 63 locations. The 4W report is [available here](#).
- Food Security and Livelihoods Sub-Cluster (FSLSC) was activated in Jakarta and in Palu, led by the Ministry of Agriculture and Ministry of Social Affairs and activities coordinated by BAPPENAS in close collaboration with the government line ministries.
- The role of the FSLSC is to support the Government activities and efforts across the food security and recovery thematic areas. WFP together with FAO are supporting the cluster.
- World Food Programme is also [providing logistical access maps](#). They are also assisting the BNPB and AHA Centre in coordinating the cargo air-bridge from Balikpapan to Palu.
- Catholic Relief Services had also conducted their [Rapid Market Analysis](#) focusing on food and construction materials for the affected population.
- UNICEF is providing assistance and programmes in WASH, Child protection, Infrastructure and Education. Part of their operations focuses on health and nutrition for the vulnerable (particularly children under 5) and addressing issues related to neo-natal and maternal health.
- 121,298 people have gained access to safe drinking water.
- Hygiene promotion sessions have been carried out in 21 IDP camps with over 800 participants.
- 1,389,626 children have been vaccinated against measles and rubella.
- 1,015 pregnant and lactating women have received counselling on Infant and Young Child Feeding (IYCF) practices and 93 health care and non-health care workers were trained in Infant Feeding in Emergency.
- 12,000 children received psychosocial support at 10 child friendly spaces.
- 56,400 children have resumed their education through provision of temporary learning spaces.
