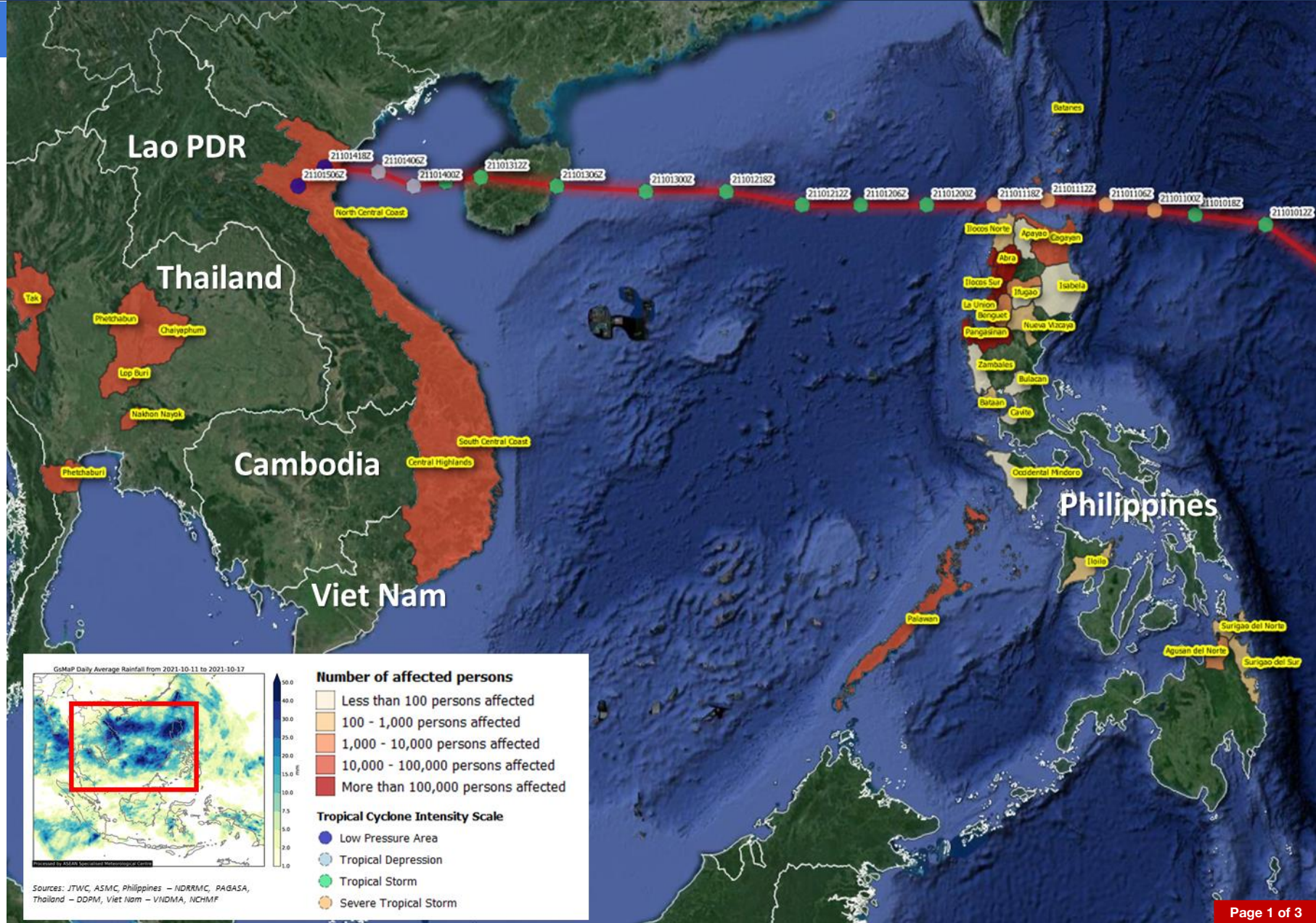

PHILIPPINES

- **RELATED INCIDENTS:** A total of **257 flooded areas** (230 of which have already subsided), **43 rain-induced landslides** in Region 1, 2, 3, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, 6, CARAGA, and CAR as reported by the National Disaster Risk and Management Council ([NDRRMC](#)).
- **IMPACTS:** According to the situational report from the [NDRRMC](#), as of 20 Oct, TC KOMPASU have caused the following: **248,263 families (940,847 persons) affected in 1,788 barangays, 130,035 people displaced** (1,775 in 60 evacuation centres), **41 dead, 17 missing, and 5 injured**.
- **DAMAGES:** **10,562 houses** (570 totally, 9,992 partially), **320 roads** (314 of which are already passable), **39 bridges** (25 of which are already passable), and **46.8M USD worth of damages to agriculture and 38.9M USD worth of damages to infrastructure**. A total of **140 cities/municipalities** experienced **power outage** (power has been restored in 130 cities/municipalities) and **11 cities/municipalities** experienced **water shortage** (supply has been restored in 10 cities/municipalities).
- **PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE:**
 - **1,1418 families (5,461 persons) were preemptively evacuated** and **1.76M USD worth of assistance** (in the form of hygiene kits, family food packs, sleeping kits and modular tents, AICS, malong, blanket, sleeping kits, burial assistance to AICS, financial, family kits, sleeping kits, kitchen kits, RTEF) has been provided to victims in Region 1, 2, 3, MIMAROPA, and CAR.
 - At the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) Central Office and Field Offices the following are available: **21.3M USD worth of standby funds, 318.2K family food packs worth 3.7M USD, other food and non-food items worth 14.2M USD** ([DSWD](#));
 - The [NDRRMC](#) has been on **ALERT STATUS: RED** since the start of the pandemic. Coordination with local disaster management agencies and relevant authorities, data collection, search and rescue operations, and rapid assessment are ongoing; the [NDRRMC](#) met regional authorities on 18 October to discuss the result of their assessments and based on this meeting, the impacts of **TC KOMPASU** to the Philippines is still within the national capacity.
- The AHA Centre will continue to monitor and issue necessary updates once more information from official sources becomes available.

THAILAND

- **OVERVIEW:** Thailand's Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation ([DDPM](#)) reported that the influence of **TC KOMPASU** which weakened to a low-pressure cell as it made landfall in mainland Southeast Asia together with the monsoon trenches over the central region and the lower northeastern region while the strong southwest monsoon prevails over the Andaman Sea, southern regions, and the Gulf of Thailand from the 15th to the 17th of October has resulted in flash floods and flooding.
- **IMPACTS and DAMAGES:**
 - **3,326 households** (estimated 16,630 persons) **affected** in 6 provinces of Thailand (Tak, Phetchabun, Chaiyaphum, Lopburi, Prachinburi, Nakhon Nayok).
- **UPDATE:** As of 21 October, the situation has been resolved in four provinces (Tak, Phetchabun, Chaiyaphum, and Nakhon Nayok); Flooding reportedly persists in Lopburi and Prachinburi.
- **RESPONSE:**
 - The provincial office of the Disaster Prevention and Mitigation Center of Lopburi has installed water pumps to pump water from flooded areas to the Paniad Reservoir to aid flooded areas.
 - The Disaster Mitigation Battalion volunteers of Prachinburi are ready to aid victims of flooding.

VIET NAM

- **OVERVIEW:** from the 15th to the 19th of October, the Viet Nam National Disaster Management Authority ([VNDMA](#)) has reported losses and damages in the Central Regions and Central Highlands of Viet Nam.
- **IMPACTS and DAMAGES:**
 - **5 dead** (2 from Nghe An province, 1 from Hoa Binh province, 2 from Quang Binh province), **2 people missing** (1 from Quang Binh and 1 from Quang Tri), and **2 injured** (from Quang Tri);
 - **2,144 damaged houses** (248 unroofed, 1896 flooded);
 - **6 schools** and **2 medical facilities** hit by landslide;
 - **2,669 ha of rice fields, 1042 ha of other crops, 3,044 livestock** were lost, **173 ha of aquaculture farm** flooded or damage;
 - **1,531 m of irrigation canals damaged, 3,895 m of riverbank and coastline were damaged** (including 1,040 km of breakwater were broken)
 - **14 points of national highway damaged, 105 locations of provincial road** affected by 36,000 cubic meters of soil and rock.
- The AHA Centre is in active communication with the VNDMA focal persons in the instance that the need for international assistance would be required.
